1. Main Contents and Activities 주요내용 및 활동

- Delivered presentation on previous APCC work in the Pacific Islands region as well as an outline of our potential future activities in the region
- Gained positive feedback on the PICASO system from Meteorological Services directors present included in the PICAPS project update to PICASO. PICASO has been reported to be well-utilized in various Meteorological Services.
- Identified opportunities to coordinate efforts across various projects such as PICAPS, COSPPac, and other partner projects in the Pacific (held side meetings with NIWA, BoM, and SPREP)
- Provided insight and feedback regarding COSPPac phase 1 and phase 2 to avoid overlap in work between organizations
 - ❖ COSPPac Phase 2 will last for 4 years (2018 - 2022) with a total budget of 75 million AUD
- Obtained information regarding the new Access-S forecast system launched by BoM for Australia and the Pacific region.

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- Pacific Meteorological Directors made the decision and joint statement that they would like for APCC's climate work in the Pacific to continue.
 - Pacific Meteorological Directors expressed their positive enthusiasm regarding the upcoming training program to be held in Kiribati on June 5~8.

- The information gained during this workshop helped inform the PICAPS project activities and the revisions to be made to PICASO

3. Suggestions and Remarks 건의사항

- Australia BoM will be pushing usage of Access-S in the Pacific. APCC should take that into account and monitor the usage of Access-S and its reliability in the region while advertising our own models.
- Recommend APCC to continue conversations with BoM, NIWA, and other partners in the Pacific regarding collaborations and avoiding duplication of efforts.

The Bureau of Meteorology's Climate and Oceans Support Program in the Pacific (COSPPac), funded by the Australian Government, will be holding its final Planning meeting and the eleventh Steering Committee meeting from 8th to 9th May 2018, this will be followed by the COSPPac Phase 2 (COSPPac2) Pre-implementation and planning Workshop from 10th to 11th May 2018. The arrangements for these meetings will be coordinated by the Pacific Community (SPC).

COSPPac is a major component of the Australian Government's assistance to Pacific Island countries in adapting to and mitigating the impacts of climate variability and change. Phase 1 (COSPPac1) began in July 2012 and ends June 2018. The second phase will be a four-year program extending to June 2022 and its design will build on extensive feedback provided throughout COSPPac.

The design of COSPPac2 is part of a broader Australia Pacific Climate Change Action Program (APCCAP). COSPPac2 will continue much of the work of the current program as well as additional information and context from the overarching APCCAP design which COSPPac2 will be a key part of. This includes principles that COSPPac2 will aspire to with regards to supporting Pacific communities and having an even greater end user focus.

COSPPac is implemented in partnership with the Pacific Island National Meteorological Services (NMSs) and Lands & Survey Departments (LSDs), Geoscience Australia (GA), the Pacific Community (SPC) and the Secretariat of the Pacific Regional Environment Programme (SPREP). The Program also coordinates its activities with the World Meteorological Organization (WMO), the National Institute of Water and Atmospheric Research (NIWA), the University of the South Pacific (USP) and other national and regional partners and donors.

The COSPPac Planning meeting will be held Tuesday 8th May 2018, and it is anticipated that representatives from all the aforementioned organisations will participate.

The purpose of the Planning meeting is to:

- Present the COSPPac1 Completion Report for activities completed;
- Present progress reports on transition implementation as well as tools and products delivered by the Program over the last nine months; and
- Discuss the current work and transition plans for the remainder of 2017-18.

The Eleventh COSPPac Steering Committee will meet on Wednesday 9th May 2018, with attendance limited to Steering Committee members. The Committee is responsible for the overall governance of the Program and its primary role is to provide strategic oversight and direction for COSPPac. It is essential for the success of COSPPac that the plans address the priorities of its partners and that they complement related regional and national activities. This will be the final meeting for phase 1.

The final design and implementation planning for COSPPac2 will take place at the COSPPac Phase 2 Pre-implementation Workshop Thursday 10th and Friday 11th May 2018. During this workshop the final design report and annexes, including the completion of the performance assessment framework, the risk register and confirmation of COSPPac2's consultative and management structures will be presented and agreed to between the implementing and delivery partners. A draft annual work plan for 2018-19 will be presented and revised in line with workshop outcomes.

Accordingly, we wish to extend an invitation to you to participate in the COSPPac1 Planning meeting and COSPPac2 Pre-implementation Workshop. If you are able to attend, please arrange to complete and return the attached participant nomination form to Sainimere Kaukimoce (sainimerek@spc.int) and with a cc to both Molly Powers (mollyp@spc.int), and the COSPPac Support Team (COSPPac_Support@bom.gov.au) by Monday 16 April 2018. If you are unable to attend, you may wish to nominate an appropriate delegate to attend on your behalf.

Unfortunately, COSPPac will not be able to provide funding support for your attendance. Nevertheless, I do hope that it is possible for you to participate. The meeting agendas and accompanying papers will be circulated prior to the commencement of the meetings.
