- 각 나라별로 상세화된 계절예측정보가 주요 산출물 중 하나인데, APCC의 MME에 대한 활용이 가능한지에 대해 제안하였으며, APCC MME 역시 지역특화 계절예측정보를 생산하기 위한 작업을 하고 있으니 다중모형을 활용한 계절예측 정보의 제공이 계획되어 있다면 APCC가 관련 컴포넌트에서 협력할 수 있는 가능성을 알아볼 필요가 있음을 언급함

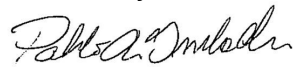

Background

The World Meteorological Organization (WMO) in collaboration with University of Southern Queensland (USQ) and International Center for Tropical Agriculture (CIAT) is currently in inception phase of the recently approved project called, *“Applying seasonal climate forecasting and innovative insurance solutions to climate risk management in the agriculture sector in South East Asia”*. Otherwise known as the **“De-RISK South East Asia” Project**, it aims to develop climate risk management systems, best practices and insurance products that will protect smallholder farmers and businesses engaged in producing coffee, sugar, rice, cassava, rubber, dairy, and grazing across the agricultural value chain in key South East Asian countries — Vietnam, Lao PDR, Cambodia, Myanmar — from physical and financial disaster associated with climate change. Furthermore, the project will assist governments in developing national/regional adaptation and risk management strategies which is responsive to the needs and climate adaptation challenges of each country. With funding support from German Federal Ministry for the Environment, Nature Conservation, and Nuclear Safety (BMU) through the International Climate Initiative (IKI), the project team is organizing a kick-off event to be held on 17 and 18 October 2018 in Ha Noi, Vietnam to officially launch this regional initiative.

Objectives

The project kick-off meeting aims to increase the awareness of key stakeholders in agriculture sector on available climate risk management and transfer mechanisms including the application of seasonal climate forecasts and crop insurance products for vulnerable farmers and industries. Specifically, the activity aims to: i) formally launch the project to relevant stakeholders, in-country partners and donors; ii) level-off understanding among project team and participants on the overall project goal/targets; and iii) define potential areas and opportunities to work together in the four countries to achieve development outcomes.
